# Workshop 10

## Cleaning fuel pump mini filter Nissan Mistral 2.7TD

#### **Fault:**

Poor fuel consumption
Excessive smoking
Miss-firing under load.
Low revs unable to rev faster
Lack of power
General symptoms are fuel starvation.


#### Repair:

Remove small banjo filter located behind the power steering pump.




Tools: Socket set or ring spanners up to between 10mm - 14mm 400mm length, piece of straight wire (clothes hanger) to be made into a hook, Hammer for making hook, White spirits.

First disconnect the battery and remove. This allow access to Power Steering Pump mounting bolts



Loosen off bottom mounting bolt with a 12mm ring spanner or socket

Loosen off the top power steering pump tensioner to allow removal of the belt.





Once the belt is off, move the pump out of the way, without disconnecting the pipes.






Undo bolt and remove being careful not to loose the flat washer. Watch out for a spring.







By hammering the end of a piece of wire one can make a hook to remove the filter




Now with your hook fish gently around until you hook the filter and gently pull out. This might take some patience. **Try not to damage the filter.** 



## **Elusive Filter**





To clean the filter of any gunk that is embedded in the filter, rinse in a solution of white spirits and dry before reassembling.

### When finished cleaning reassemble in reverse order.
